SAPREF offers bursaries to students in the following fields of study:

The bursary covers: • Tuition • Residence fees • Meals • Books • Practical work experience as set by the University.

Prerequisites: • South African citizenship • Studying towards a Bachelor of Science or confirmed acceptance from a South African University • Minimum of 60% average in 2011 mid-year exam results.

Selection is based primarily on academic merit. However, we look for well-rounded individuals who demonstrate potential to excel in other areas of their lives. Applicants will undergo a selection process, which includes psychometric tests and panel interviews.

Successful applicants get a chance to work at SAPREF during their vacation periods, allowing them to gain practical experience in their chosen field of study.
